## LIFENET NEWS

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- **LifeNet announced its 10-10-10 Vision for 2023.** This vision includes expanding to 10 countries of operation and scaling to 10,000,000 improved patient visits annually by dramatically growing our resource base to \$10 million in annual revenue.
- **LifeNet was named a Global Health Innovation Grantee by the Pfizer Foundation.** This is the fourth year that the Pfizer Foundation has selected LifeNet for its cohort of GHIG grantees. The grant will fund LifeNet's work among a cohort of 10 facilities in Uganda.
