


THE POWER OF PREVENTION

Access to the tools facilities need to save lives.




DIGITAL LEARNING Accessible online training & support designed for low-resourced settings.


WE WORK: THE LIFENET MODEL

KELLEN & ESTHER

Kellen Mashanyu is a mother in Uganda who found herself facing every mother's greatest fear: Her baby daughter, Esther, came down with malaria a disease that takes the lives of hundreds of thousands of children each year. In fact, every 2 minutes, a child under the age of 5 dies of malaria. You can imagine the anxiety and urgency that Kellen felt as she carried Esther (pictured above) to find healthcare. Kellen took Esther to a LifeNet partner facility to get vital malaria treatment, and Esther has recovered well! The deaths of children like Esther from common diseases like malaria **are preventable.**






MALARIA CASES TREATED IN 2021


